
# **Happy Holidays from the Retirees Association**

#### Second Harvest Food Bank fills an important role in the community



Food insecurity affects the lives of many across Santa Cruz County, including UCSC students. One in three residents of Santa Cruz County reported food insecurity in 2022. Second Harvest Food Bank helps combat that insecurity by reaching 65,000 people across the county each month and relies heavily on volunteers to do so.

UC Santa Cruz has partnered with the Second Harvest Food Bank to help alleviate food insecurity, participating in <a href="holiday food drives">holiday food drives</a> and coordinating volunteer efforts. Of the 1,896 people who <a href="volunteer with Second Harvest">volunteer with Second Harvest</a> Food Bank in Santa Cruz County, many are UCSC retirees.

After serving the U.S. in various branches of the country's military division, many veterans decide to return to school and further themselves in the classroom.

According to data from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs from 2018, nearly 700,000 veterans use VA education benefits, namely the GI Bill, to pay for college, graduate school, and training programs, and that number appears to be growing. Across the University of California system of 10 schools, nearly 2,000 veterans and students with military affiliations attend.
